Update: Saving Our Brick Streets

Bob Jordan, head of the committee appointed to finding a way to save the brick streets in Gibraltar Neighborhood, gave a report on this project at our June membership meeting. According to Bob, estimates have been gathered showing what brick street maintenance and repairs have cost in other cities, compared to what it might cost for our streets. Pricing averaged \$85.00 sq. yard to lay brick, plus \$35 labor. There will be a sewer project coming up Willow that we would tie into when our streets are done, as that would be part of the project. It was decided that 3rd Street would be first priority, then 5th would follow that.

Kirn Park Project by Paulette Brandt

As many of you may have noticed, there has been a lot of activity at Kirn Park, at the top of 5th Ave.

The Gibraltar N.A. partnered with the Fairmount neighborhood association and contacted Mutual of Omaha to be the recipients of a grant to restore Kirn Park. Mutual does this every September as part of their volunteer month.

We got together with the City Parks Department Head, Larry Foster, and a plan was formed. The City graciously offered to do the sandblasting of the concrete grandstand, so it could be painted, and bought the paint.

Then, Mutual of Omaha volunteers came on September 16th and 17th and painted, along with neighborhood volunteers. It was fun and it was amazing how much can be accomplished with 20 or 30 people focused on a task. This is just the first stage in the master plan. As Kirn has long been the target of vandalism, security cameras have been installed. Hopefully this will help to not only deter vandals, but also identify anyone attempting to deface the property.

Additional lighting will be installed, a barricade to keep motorized vehicles off the field and track, and possibly a new exterior fence to replace the old one. Bars will be put on the backside of the grandstand to keep people from going under there and lighting fires etc.

Tips to Improve Your Credit Score for Home Buying

Lenders analyze your FICO score (credit score) to determine whether or not to approve you for a home loan. A credit score is a statistical model that evaluates and compares credit rata to determine whether a consumer will default on their loan obligation in the future. Scores range from 300 to 850. The higher the score, the less are the odds of default. The better your score, the better your interest rate will be and the faster you will be able to close on a loan.

- 1. Pay credit card balances in full each month.
- **2. Pay off collection accounts in full**. Start with the smaller balances as these should be easier to handle all at once. Once these are paid in full, request that the account is closed and demand a letter be sent to you verifying that has been done. If you are unable to pay collection accounts in full, call to request a partial payment plan.
- **3. Do not close credit cards with a strong history of on-time payments**. These build your credit history and reflect positively on your credit scores.
- 4. Bring any past due credit cards current immediately.
- 5. Make sure a credit limit is being reports to the credit bureaus for all open accounts.
- **6. Share outstanding debt among many cards**. Debt below 50% of credit limit is good; below 30% is excellent.
- 7. Bring accounts current. Make payments on time or, if possible, 1-week before they are due.
- 8. Don't pay off accounts when 30-days late; just make them current moving forward.
- **9. Keep credit separate from your spouse**. If you don't, the result will be that if one is maxed out, both parties are maxed out, and if one is delinquent, both parties are delinquent.
- **10. If you have a credit card with a zero balance, use it for purchasing small items and then pay it in full each month** usage once every 6 months is recommended.
- **11. Avoid shopping for additional forms of credit**. Every time you apply for credit, your credit report is pulled which can have a negative impact on your credit scores. Limit inquiries.
- **12. Avoid transferring balances from one card to another** unless the difference in the interest rate is going to allow you to make additional payments on other open and owing accounts.
- **13. Avoid co-signing for another family or friends** as you assume their debt as your own when you do.
- 14. Work on cleaning up any "incorrect" information on your credit report. Often these reports are not accurate so comb through each line item to make sure that you indeed have or have had an account with that vendor.

Your home is one of your largest assets. A mortgage account paid on time is one of the best ways to build healthy credit.



RECIPE Corner: Apple Goodie provided by Paulette Brandt

3 C diced apples 1 C sugar 1 Tblsp flour (heaping) Dash salt 1-½ tsp cinnamon 1/4 baking soda 1/3 C butter (melted) 3/4 C brown sugar 3/4 C rolled oats

Combine apples, 1 C sugar, flour, salt & cinnamon. Mix Well. Place this mixture in an 8" or 9" square pan.



Combine remaining ingredients and pour on top. Bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes or until apples are tender.
