

PLEASE PLAN TO ATTEND May's neighborhood meeting—WE NEED YOUR INPUT! In addition to a general business discussion (what's happening with neighborhood re-zoning requests, updates on side-walk repair, street repair, etc., we welcome special Guest Presenter Morgan Wade from the 712 Initiative.

Morgan will be conducting a <u>SWOT ANALYSIS</u> for our neighborhood. SWOT is a tool for conducting a strategic analysis. It is used to analyze an entity, and the environment in which it operates. SWOT stands for Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, and Threats. Information in a SWOT analysis is organized into internal and external factors:

- 1. An examination of the Strengths and Weaknesses of an entity. This is an <u>internal</u> look at operations used to identify what the entity does well, & where it needs to improve. It focuses on the current situation.
- 2. An examination of the <u>external</u> environment in which the entity operates. This means identifying industry trends and outside forces that could pose Threats or provide Opportunities for the entity. *It focuses on the future.*

As we work to develop and implement the long-range strategy for bettering the Gibraltar neighborhood, it will be imperative to have a clear understanding of where we've been, where we are now, and where we want to be in the future! YOU (and your voice!) play a critical role in the success of this mission! *SEE YOU THEN!*

SWOT ANALYSIS



Re-Zoning Proposed for Gibraltar Neighborhood By Alicia Brady

The Gibraltar neighborhood turned up to explore & discuss at the City Planning hearing on 4/10 regarding the request to rezone land North of ConAgra for industrial use, and rezone the Girl Scout House property for administrative use. I am very thankful for all the support from the Gibraltar Neighborhood Association, and those of us who make up the neighborhood! However, there is still much work to be done.

The planning commission has recommended to the City Council the rezoning of the ConAgra property from residential land to industrial use. We need more support at the City Council meetings to find an amenable solution for all parties. At this point, our options are: we could request the city not rezone the land; or, we could work with the city to find middle ground for how Conagra might be required to use walls, green space buffers, landscaping and architecture styles; or, request that the city delay a decision so a larger plan for the whole area can be reached.

As for the Girl Scout House property, the planning commission recommended <u>not</u> to rezone this area. However, the City Council could overturn the recommendation and approve the rezoning to A-P administrative. This is a very sensitive issue for long-time Gibraltar residents, who have an lengthy history of having to fight to keep historic homes in tact and avoid being converted into apartment buildings and torn down for parking lots, etc.



GNA General Meeting Minutes - March 15, 2018

Attendees: Cory Peters, Tom Emmet, Roland Lynch, Marc Evans, David & Anna Brooks, Catie DeMasi (a representative from The Center), and guest Lynne Branigan from Dream Playground Re-Imagined initiative.

Deteriorating Brick Streets: Tom Emmet shared that the Board is planning to go to City Council in late May. He stated, "We will hold them accountable until our streets are fixed."

Later in the meeting, guest and former City Council Member Lynne Branigan shared that the most effective **way to communicate with the City Council is through a letterhead addressed "To the City Council."** This letter will go to all members of the City Council and they will have a chance to respond. The next step is to follow up the letter by attending the following City Council Meeting.

At this meeting bring pictures to show deterioration on the street, and be willing to leave them with the Council Members. Feel free to ask specific Council Members who you did not hear back from to share their thoughts on the issue presented. Lynn also shared that the best month to present matters to the City council is in late November or December since in January the budget begins to be formed for the following year.

With this information, the board will reassess the most strategic next step regarding our deteriorating streets.



Making Nextdoor.com Work for You

We have a wonderful resource in the website <u>Nextdoor.com</u>. We've also heard some feedback that many users get messages from *other* neighborhoods/neighbors that are simply not relevant

to the Gibraltar area. Did you know that *you can change the settings on the site* to control what kind of messages you receive?

Log into <u>www.nextdoor.com</u>, then on the upper-**right corner of the page you'll see your profile image (if you** loaded one) and a down arrow that looks like this: v. Next, click on the down arrow and then click on "settings." You'll see that you can then identify what types of emails you'd like to receive: either "just my neighborhood" or "my neighborhood + nearby". Personally, I've chosen "just my neighborhood" for everything and that's made the amount of emails from Nextdoor I get much more manageable.

You also see that you can select other settings to include "mobile alerts," identify what neighborhoods in Council Bluffs constitute as "nearby," and establish your privacy settings.

Historic Neighborhood Homes: THE FOLSOM HOUSES

In this issue I will address two historical homes that sit side by side on Third Street. They are known as the Folsom Houses and their occupants contributed to the early history of Council Bluffs. Located at 137 Third Street, the home of Jeremiah Folsom was built in 1856 in the Italianate style (as shown in this photo, right) by pioneer newspaper man Jeremiah Folsom (publisher of the *Chronotype*). The house originally sat farther **back on the lot, against the yellow bluffs on which stood the town's brick,** mansard-roof high school: Abraham Lincoln High. When the bluff was cut **back in 1906, Ward Folsom, Jeremiah's son, had the house moved forward**



and extensively remodeled, changing its Italianate style to a Foursquare style with Colonial Revival details. The two-story house has a hipped roof and dormers. The wraparound porch with double and triple sets of round columns were added in 1906. Ward Folsom, a contractor, lived in the house until his death in 1967.



The house at 135 Third Street (pictured at left) is known as the Agnes Folsom House, built in 1906 by Ward Folsom for his mother, the widow of Jeremiah Folsom. This Colonial Revival/Queen Anne (Free Classic) house features a Palladian window in the gable end, an oculus window, rounded hip dormers on the front room slope, two-story rounded bay window, and a porch that has double and triple sets of round columns on brick piers.

Jeremiah Folsom was born March 13, 1817 in Tamworth, Carroll Co., New Hampshire. His family were early pioneers from England. He came

to Council Bluffs in 1854 with W. W. Maynard, the founder of the Nonpareil. Shortly after their arrival, Folsom founded and edited the first rival newspaper to the Bugle, edited by Lysander Babbitt, and the battle was on! Scanning the two papers from 100 years ago gives one a real taste of what editorial rivalry was in those days. The Folsom paper was the *Chronotype*, which was soon followed by the publication of the *Nonpareil*. The

Nonpareil took up the political (and often-times even social) battle were the *Chronotype* left off.

Folsom purchased 200 acres of land in Pottawattamie County and became one of the largest owners of real estate in the city, where he engaged in agricultural pursuits for many years. He was also a glass manufacturer per the 1850 Census Index.

At the time of his arrival, and for years afterward, the plains of Iowa and Kansas were unsafe for white settlers. Mr. Folsom assisted in the

organization of the military company in Council Bluffs, which was the

predecessor of Company L., 168th Infantry, the oldest in the Iowa National Guard to fight the hostile Indians. The organization has fought in every American war since then.



The Folsom Family plot is located in Fairview Cemetery in section "A" right off the entrance. Originally, the cemetery was called "Old Burying Grounds" because many Indians are buried there along with about 300 Mormons and many of the city's most prominent citizens (include the Folsom family).
