Protect Your Identity

Neighbors, once you put your trash out for collection you lose any expectation of privacy. It is not against the law for someone to go through your trash (unless they are making a mess, then it is a different story). Consider shredding any type of paperwork that may have your name on it. Dumpster diving is one of many ways a person can get your personal information. It is safer to shred then to be sorry.

All a thief needs is your Social Security number to commit identity theft. But, once you know the facts and preventive measures to take, you can win the fight against identity theft! Identity thieves commit their crime in several ways:

- They dig through garbage cans or communal dumpsters in search of cancelled checks, credit card and bank statements, and preapproved credit card offers.
- They steal credit card payments and other outgoing mail from private, curbside mailboxes.
- They hack into computers containing personal records and steal the data.
- They file a change of address form in the victim's name to divert mail and gather personal and financial data.

Clues Your Information Has Been Stolen

- You see withdrawals from your bank account that you can't explain.
- You don't get your bills or other mail.
- Merchants refuse your checks.
- Debt collectors call you about debts that aren't yours.
- You find unfamiliar accounts or charges on your credit report.
- Medical providers bill you for services you didn't use.
- Your health plan rejects your medical claim because the records show you've reached your benefits limit.
- A health plan won't cover you because your medical records show a condition you don't have.
- The IRS notifies you that more than one tax return was filed in your name, or that you have income from an employer you don't work for.
- You get notice that your information was compromised by a data breach at a company where you do business or have an account.

Meeting adjourned at 7:00 pm



It's time to Get Your Vote On!

Let your voice be heard! Do your civic duty and embrace your democracy. Many folks around the world would love to have this opportunity. Do you have a plan? Register to vote, request an absentee ballot, track your ballot request, and find your polling place.

First of all you must register to vote. Register to vote or update your voter registration <u>online</u> using your Iowa driver's license or ID number. *You will receive your voter registration card from your county auditor within two weeks.* You can also register at your precinct's polling place. To learn more or to find answers to your questions, visit the Iowa Secretary of State's office at:



HOWEVER, time is running out! If you still need to register, do it as soon as possible!



There are three ways you can vote in the state of Iowa!

1. Vote by mail

This year, due to Covid-19 Secretary of State Paul Pate, has (or will) send every registered voter in Iowa an Absentee Ballot Request (ABR). You may even have been sent MORE than one. Only one is necessary! Read the instructions carefully, fill out the form and send it in NO LATER THAN OCTOBER 20th!! You can keep track of where your ballot is in the process at this site:

2. Early vote in person

Starting on October 5th and continuing Monday-Friday 8:00am to 4:30pm, you can vote in person at the courthouse all the way up until November 2nd.

3. Vote in person at the polls on November 3rd 2020

If this is your choice please check where your polling site will be this year as things could change due to Covid-19. Check for your polling place before November 3rd at:

Expect a long line and take a jacket, water, a snack etc... just in case the line is longer than you anticipated.

YARD WASTE TIPS for Fall

As we move into the end of summer and the leaves begin to fall, you may have more yard waste to set at your curbside. Here are some tips and reminders for your yard waste.

- > Remember to always separate trash from yard waste. These items are collected separately by RR the City's waste hauler. If yard waste is not separate, it will be tagged and not collected.
- > On your curb, place your yard waste a few feet away from trash, so waste haulers recognize where one ends and the other begins. Yard waste may be placed in a regular garbage can, City-approved Poly-cart, or paper yard waste bags. Mark containers with a "Y" or place an orange yard waste sticker on each can.
- > Gather limbs and branches into bundles no more than 4' in length, 2' in diameter & 60 pounds in weight. Tie yard waste bundles with string or twine.

Yard waste is unlimited through November 30. Pumpkins, corn stalks and other garden waste can be placed with yard waste.

CITY ORDINANCE on Open Burning

With the cooler weather, folks are compelled to be outside, enjoying the cooler weather... and what's better than a bonfire on a Fall evening! However, the City Code limits the type of fires you can have, so here's a condensed run-down of what is and isn't allowed. For more detailed information on City Codes, go to: library.municode.com/ia/council_bluffs/codes/code_of_ordinances

- 1) **Open burning is prohibited.** This means the burning of any material that results in contaminants from combustion being emitted directly into the ambient air without passing through a stack or chimney from any enclosed chamber.
- 2) This does not apply to outdoor fireplaces or BBQ grills used solely for the noncommercial preparation of food. These fireplaces or grills can't be used for burning refuse or combustible waste.
- 3) Fire containment devices like fire pits and chimineas may be used but are subject to certain provisions as follows:
 - no outdoor burning allowed if winds exceed 10 mph
 - fires must be constantly attended by a responsible adult until thoroughly extinguished
 - fire containment devices shall not be permitted within 15 feet of any combustible structure, or within 10 feet of a lot line (unless mutually agreed upon by neighboring property owner)
 - fire pits or other fire containment devices shall not exceed 3 feet in diameter
 - flames shall be kept below 2 feet in height above the pit or containment device
 - a portable fire extinguisher or garden hose must be readily available
 - excessive smoke or odor emissions are prohibited


