## Trim your "STREET WEEDS"

Many Gibraltar neighbors have raised concerns over the 'shaggy' appearance of our neighborhood due to the abundance of weeds growing through the bricks along most curb areas. Please do your part to try and improve our neighborhood appearance by trimming or killing the weeds. If using an application to kill the weeds, please do try to use an ecologically-friendly solution. For example: Mix 1 gallon white vinegar with 1 cup salt and 1 tablespoon liquid dish soap. The white vinegar lowers the weed's pH, the salt dries out the plant, and the dish soap helps the solution stick to the plant. Pour the solution into a spray bottle, and spray it over the weed's stalk and leaves. Apply it liberally. Then reapply the solution after 24 hours until the weed is completely dead.

## **BANNER DESIGN** — Final Selection!

We've made quite a bit of progress on the GNA Banner initiative since the August newsletter! We have a signed agreement with the City of Council Bluffs and Mid-American energy, and our Grant application has been written and will be submitted to hopefully cover some of the over \$5,500 in costs. Thanks to everyone who weighed-in on the design! Based on the voting, we've narrowed the final banner selection to two designs. We've also decided to go with a BURGUNDY fabric (instead of the pine green) to tie-in with our Gibraltar yard flags and Gibraltar T-shirts. We've posted the two designs to the NextDoor site for input, but please be aware that **only the feedback of paid neighborhood association members** will have bearing on the final design selection. (Just one more reason you should join the GNA if you haven't yet!)



I'm excited to report that we're nearing the final preparations for the banner initiative. We have secured the signed approvals/agreements from the City of Council Bluffs and Mid-American Energy for installation of the banners on utility poles. Now we just need the money to pay for the banners!! We've applied for grant money but will also need some matching funds (hence the Dodge House fundraiser!!). I will be so excited to finally see the banners installed (unsure if that will happen during the winter or not... might be waiting 'til Spring).

At the September board meeting the sidewalk repair project was again discussed. Several details were finalized and decisions made. As you know, **sidewalk maintenance is the responsibility of each homeowner** (don't we wish the city would pay for that?!). To maximize funding dollars and integrate owner commitment, the homeowner will be responsible for the <u>tear-out</u> portion of the repair (ie. you can take it out yourself, pay someone else to take it out, or pay the concrete installer to take it out), and the <u>GNA will pay for the concrete installation and/or repair</u>, saving you somewhere in the neighborhood of 50-75% of the total cost of the repair/replacement. Repair locations will be selected on a first-come, first-served basis, *with GNA paid members getting first access to available program monies* (yet *another* reason to join the Neighborhood Association if you haven't yet done so). Additional information and details will be forthcoming.

## HOMES OF GIBRALTAR: 129 Bluff Street, by Mary Lou McGinn

Thomas Metcalf purchased this property in 1892 from Mary Clinton, widow of attorney Samuel Clinton who lived next door at 133 Bluff Street.

Thomas and Henry Metcalf came to Council Bluffs from Ohio in the fall of 1867 and opened a hat and cap store in an 8 x 20-foot room on the south side of Broadway. In 1869 they were joined by their brother, George. Metcalf Bros., a retail business selling hats, caps and furs, and later adding clothing, soon expanded into a wholesale business with stocks of goods, occupying the Whitney block on Broadway. Fifteen years later they moved to 17 and 19 Pearl Street, and 18 and 20 Main Street - a block owned by Thomas Metcalf. They later opened a jobbing firm.

According to The Blue Book of Iowa Women, Eva Canfield and Thomas Metcalf were married in Charder, Ohio in 1871. The couple had three children: Thomas, Jr., Frank, and Della. Mrs. Metcalf was a very active member of the Daughters of the American Revolution, representing the local chapter in the statewide organization. She was also a member of the first Garden Club in Council Bluffs. The black topsoil seen today on the lawn and garden was hauled there by the Metcalfs.

The house had a second life. It was sold in 1907 to Ida and Joe Smith, a prominent Council Bluffs clothier. It was remodeled extensively in 1908 and exhibits a combination of the Craftsman, Prairie and Tudor Revival styles, with shingle siding on the first floor. Other notable features include original multi-pane over single-pane windows, massive roof with wide eave overhang, rectangular canted bay on the second floor front, two-story bay on the south side, roughened brick foundation, and a hipped dormer on the north side. Recent restoration reveals faux timbering on the second level. The house was converted to apartments in the 1950s, and recently restored to a single-family dwelling.

The late Norman Filbert, Jr. described the house in a 2003 Daily Nonpareil article, "Memories of Grandparents Remain Vivid." Norman recalled, "If I close my eyes, I can still see, plain as day, my grandparents and their house at 129 Bluff Street, now redesigned into apartments. I spent many exploratory hours there as a youngster, walking down from the top of the street, then paved with bricks and sporting a streetcar that ventured east and on to Pierce. My grandmother Ida was the tomboy of the family. She was the one who dressed up at Halloween and greeted guests seeking goodies with the most ghoulish of appearances at the door."

Joe Smith & Co., founded in 1905, was a familiar clothing store on Broadway for 70 years. Born in 1864 in a two-room log cabin in Marion County, the second of 10 children, Joe Smith left the farm at age 18 and came to Council Bluffs. He first worked at a bakery, then at the Pacific House Hotel. After working two more short-term jobs, he went to work for the Haverstock clothing store where he remained for five years, then the John Beno Company. In 1899 he formed a partnership, Smith & Brady, and opened a store at 415 West Broadway. Six years later, he bought out the partner and renamed the store the Joe W. Smith Co., located across the street at 416 West Broadway, its permanent home.

Smith was one of the promoters of the YMCA building, past president of the Chamber of Commerce, the Retail Merchants Assn., the Iowa Clothiers Assn., a charter member of the local Elks and Rotary groups, a director of the City National Bank, served on the Salvation Army Board and was active in Boy Scouts. An editorial in the Daily Nonpareil at the time of his death read, "He worked hard at his business, but he worked just as hard to make Council Bluffs a better place in which to live."

## GNA General Meeting Minutes, September 9, 2015

Meeting convened at 6:15 p.m. Attendees: Cathy Hill, Jeff Ketcham, Roland Lynch, Adrienne McElderry, Kyle McGinn and Patricia Murphy.

#### **OLD BUSINESS ITEMS:**

- 1) Roland looked into our concern about city staff measuring various sidewalks in our area. He spoke to a Jeremy Noel from City Operations Division but was unable to get any answers from him. He sent Roland to another facility to see someone else only to find that the facility had a locked fence and no way to enter. Therefore, he was unable to get any information.
- 2) Banners Will be burgundy with white letters (like our t-shirts.) Ann Walters is completing the grant from the Pott. Co. Community Foundation for the \$5000 they will cost.
- 3) Sidewalks Steve Gorman received Jeff Paulsen's \$5/square foot for the concrete to repair our aging sidewalks. Homeowners will be responsible for tearing out damaged sidewalks before repair can be done. **Paid Association** members will have priority. Ready Mixer contacted Steve and indicated that they would be interested in working with Paulsen on the project.

#### **NEW BUSINESS ITEMS:**

- 1) Fairmont Park contribution of \$1000 Board determined we could not afford the money now, so when the park is completed, GNA may want to contribute an attractive planter or bench at the entrance.
- 2) Picnic at Kirn Park on September 20th from 4:00 7:00 p.m. GNA will provide sloppy joes and lemonade and ask that attendees contribute a side dish.
- 3) Brick streets. The question arose about the city's commitment to spend \$10, 000 a year to repair our brick streets with bricks. Has anyone seen any work being done within our boundaries? The answer was no. The Board will pursue this matter.
- 4) Dodge House Holiday Fundraiser Cory is working with the Dodge House staff on the details. Rather than a full dinner which proved to be laborious last year, we will host a wine and hors d'oeuvres gala. Details will be provided at a later date.
