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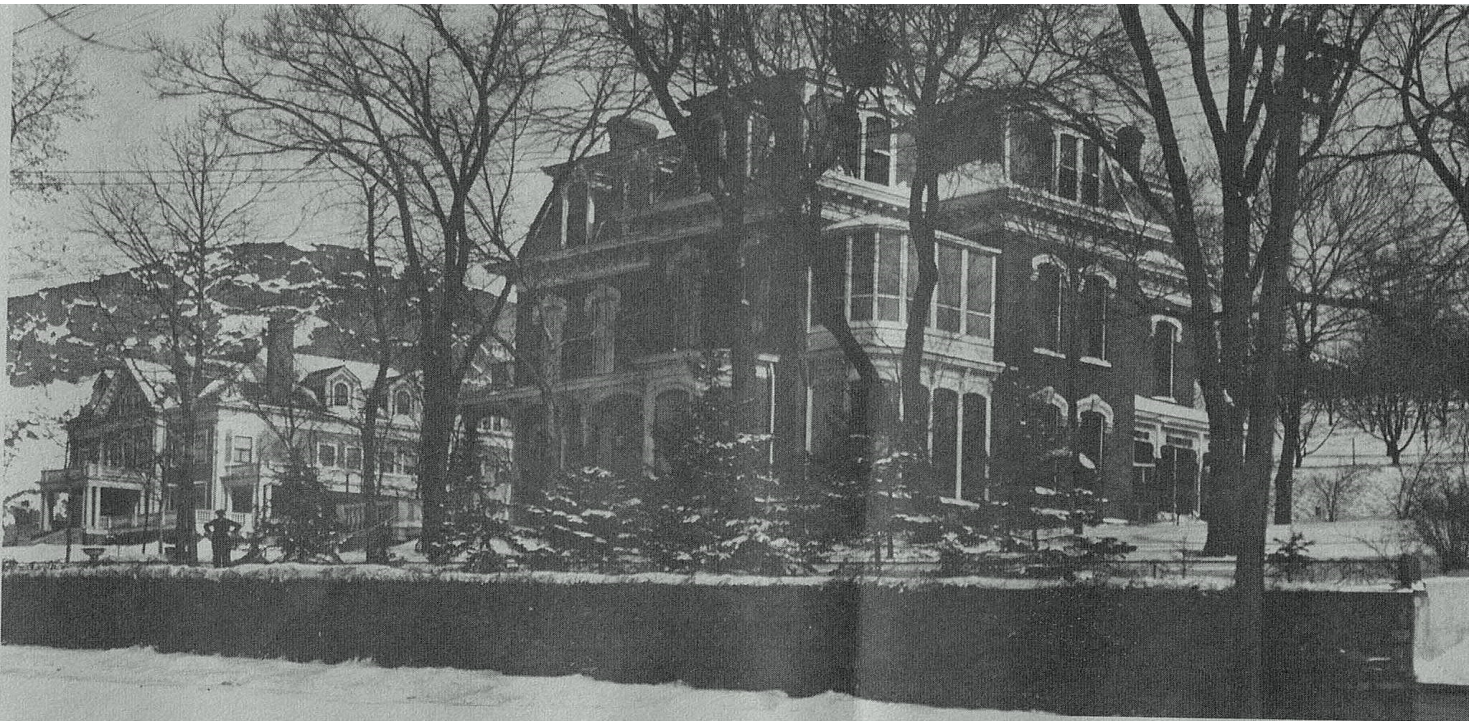

From the OMAHA DAILY BEE newspaper, Monday, October 21, 1901

“News of Interest—Council Bluffs

Ernest E. Hart, the banker, has purchased the property north of the General Dodge’s residence on Third Street, with a view to erecting a handsome home for himself. The plans under contemplation promise one of the finest residences in the city.”



This vintage photo shows the Dodge House with the Hart House in the distance, and behind it, part of the Gibraltar Mound! The Hart House was, many years later, transformed to become Young’s Rest Home, which ceased operations around the mid-1960s. Wouldn’t you love to have seen it in it’s heyday?

GNA General Meeting Minutes from July 20, 2016

8 members and 3 guests present. Meeting called to order at 6:15 p.m.

Agenda:

Our meeting kicked off with the introduction of Jill Knotek, the Police Area Representative (PAR) assigned to our sector of the city. Jill considers her primary job to be improving the quality of life in neighborhoods, which could include, but not be limited to, addressing barking dogs, unruly youth activities, drug activity, or safety concerns. Jill shared some tips on how to insure safety throughout our neighborhood. These are:

- Install motion detector lights on all four corners of homes and/or properties.
- Keep cars locked at all times, even in driveways or garages. Do not leave belongings in cars.
- When leaving town for an extended period of time, notify Jill at 712.328.4961. She will have police officers check on your property as they are cruising the area.

A discussion ensued during Jill's presentation about "dead spaces", i.e., areas with little or no light which potentially could encourage criminal activity. Jill suggested to the group that we join with other neighborhood associations to petition the City for increased lighting. The City is currently replacing the old bulbs in street lights with LED lighting, which is more energy efficient and therefore, more cost efficient. We will consider doing this.

Cory then introduced Morgan Wade and Kelsey Johnson from Pott. County Development Corporation, who will be attending our meetings, as Glennay Jundt from Habitat for Humanity is moving on and up. (We wish her all the best and thank her for her due diligence for our GNA!) Morgan will assume her responsibilities. Both Morgan and Kelsey expressed their excitement about working with and supporting GNA in future endeavors. Kelsey is responsible for maintaining a calendar of all of the non-profit entities and their activities in Council Bluffs. You can access these by emailing kelsey@bluffs/downtown.com. She also maintains 2 FaceBook accounts: [live-wellcouncilbluffs](#) and [bluffsdowntown](#).

Cory shared her NUSA (NeighborhoodsUSA) conference experience with the group. Due to an amazing presentation developed by Cory (with help from Tom Emmet), which we viewed, GNA received a national 2nd place award for best Neighborhood Social Revitalization! We thank Cory for attending the conference and are proud of her for representing us in such a stellar fashion! Incidentally, next year's NUSA conference will be in Omaha, and we anticipate GNA being an active part of that. Our own Tom Emmett and Jeff Ketcham will be attending a NUSA organizational meeting in Omaha in August, so more details will be forthcoming. Our NUSA awards will be on display at the Beresheim House next door to the Dodge House. How cool is that?!

After much discussion and research, the GNA Board has decided to pursue becoming a 501c3 entity. Kyle McGinn, a resident of GNA, has graciously agreed to be our attorney-of-note during the application process. Thank you, Kyle! Being a 501c3 will allow our association to apply for larger grant monies to improve our neighborhood. It is a necessity if we want to continue to grow.

The GNA Board will be serving the Our Savior Lutheran Board on August 17th. It is a way for us to show our deep appreciation for the privilege of using their facilities for meetings and other GNA events at no cost to the Association. Bon Appetit, OSL!

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BRICK STREET REPAIR INFO, by Cory Peters

A question was raised at a recent GNA meeting about if our neighborhood “is ensuring that the City is fulfilling their obligations regarding the process of brick street repairs in the Gibraltar neighborhood.” I am pleased to report that Greg Reeder, Director of Public Works with the City, was more than happy to clarify what procedures were enacted a few years ago, and what has transpired since then. I am happy to share these details, along with information that I hope will properly set expectations going forward.



- 1) In mid-2012, neighborhood representatives from Gibraltar and Fairmount, along with the Dodge House, met with City Officials to determine if a process could be implemented to save our brick streets. This issue really came to the forefront after repair work on 5th Avenue between Bluff and 3rd, where the utility company simply PAVED HALF OF THE STREET instead of replacing the bricks that had been removed. We didn't want the remainder of our brick streets to face the same fate when future repairs were made.
- 2) The outcome of several meetings in late 2012 was the City's concurrence that the brick streets needed to be preserved. They agreed to *try* to apply a yearly amount of \$10,000 towards the future repair and maintenance of brick streets, working with an outside contractor who was equipped to do this type of work. They *also* mandated to all the utility companies that any bricks torn up for utility work had to then be replaced/re-set as they were before. (So, notify someone if you see concrete fill being used in place of bricks!!)

Things we all need to remember:

- Gibraltar is not the only local area with brick streets needing serviced: the Fairmount Park neighborhood and the Oakland Avenue (Lincoln/Fairview) neighborhood also have sections of brick streets. So, please remember that City monies spent would be shared/allocated among all those in need.
- The City agreed they would TRY to apply a yearly allowance of \$10,000 towards the repair & maintenance of brick streets. They did NOT agree to set aside money each year regardless of other City expenditures or budget shortfalls or new priorities, etc. As Greg clarified for me, while the City recognizes Gibraltar's need, it would be impractical and impossible for them to “budget” that money each year for our neighborhood because, theoretically, every other neighborhood could then demand their OWN pool of allocated monies for their own unique projects. Understandably, the City can not and would not agree to that.

Money spent on brick street repair over the past three years:

Greg kindly shared with me the invoices they've paid for brick street repair dating back to 2013, the first year that the protocol was implemented. As you can see, they **have met or surpassed** our expenditure goal.

2013 Repairs

9/13 thru 11/13 Repairs: 5th Ave from Clark to Glenn / 5th Ave from 3rd to Clark \$9,800.00

2014 Repairs

10/14 thru 12/14 Repairs: 5th Ave from 3rd to Clark / 3rd St. from 5th to Story / 3rd St. from Fairview to Worth / 3rd St. from Story to Fairview \$9,737.00
9/14 thru 10/14 Repairs: 3rd St. from High School to Willow + curb repair \$4,180.00

2015 Repairs

12/15 Repairs: 3rd St. from Willow to Turley / 3rd St. from Story to Fairview / 3rd St. from High School to Willow / 3rd St. from Fairview to Worth / 3rd St. from Worth to 9th \$11,022.00

2016 Repairs (so far)

3/16 thru 5/16 Repairs: 5th Ave. from Clark to Glen \$6,267.25

Neighborhood Clean Up Day A Huge Success

We collected TWO LARGE DUMPSTERS of TRASH -- over 10,000 lbs (5 tons) -- gone from area neighborhoods!! Gross mattresses, broken furniture, moldy couches... there was some nasty stuff that got cleaned out!! Not to mention a trailer of re-usable items for Habitat for Humanity, and two trailers of scrap metal and dozens of old TVs that went to electronics recycling. (Probably another 6,000 lbs there!)

None of this would have been possible without: 1) Officer Jill Knotek of the C.B. Police Department, who arranged for the dumpster, and she - along with a couple other police officers - - were a HUGE help on-site with pickup, offloading and trash collection!! 2) Glennay Jundt from Habitat for Humanity - who helped keep some items out of the landfill by re-purposing them for sale at the Habitat ReStore. She also arranged for the Electronics Recycling! 3) The CB Health Dept. who donated the dumpster, and Tony from the Recycling Center, who worked his butt off cramming the dumpsters to the gills!! 4) CTI Electronics Recycling for taking all the electronics and metal stuff to recycle it! 5) Tom Emmett, Chris Gorman, Jeff Ketcham, Officer Jill Knotek and Glennay Jundt, who hand delivered flyers in advance of the event, during some hot and humid weather. 6) ANNNND, a HUGE thank you to my **AWESOME Gibraltar Volunteers**, who donated their time, sweat, muscle and trucks to pick up and off-load SO MUCH stuff: Eric Julius, Bud Dew, Chris Gorman, Gordon Hitchcock, Zack Mardquardt, Turner Morgan and Dave Adams!!! This would not have been possible without your assistance!

Thank you to all those who helped with this event!

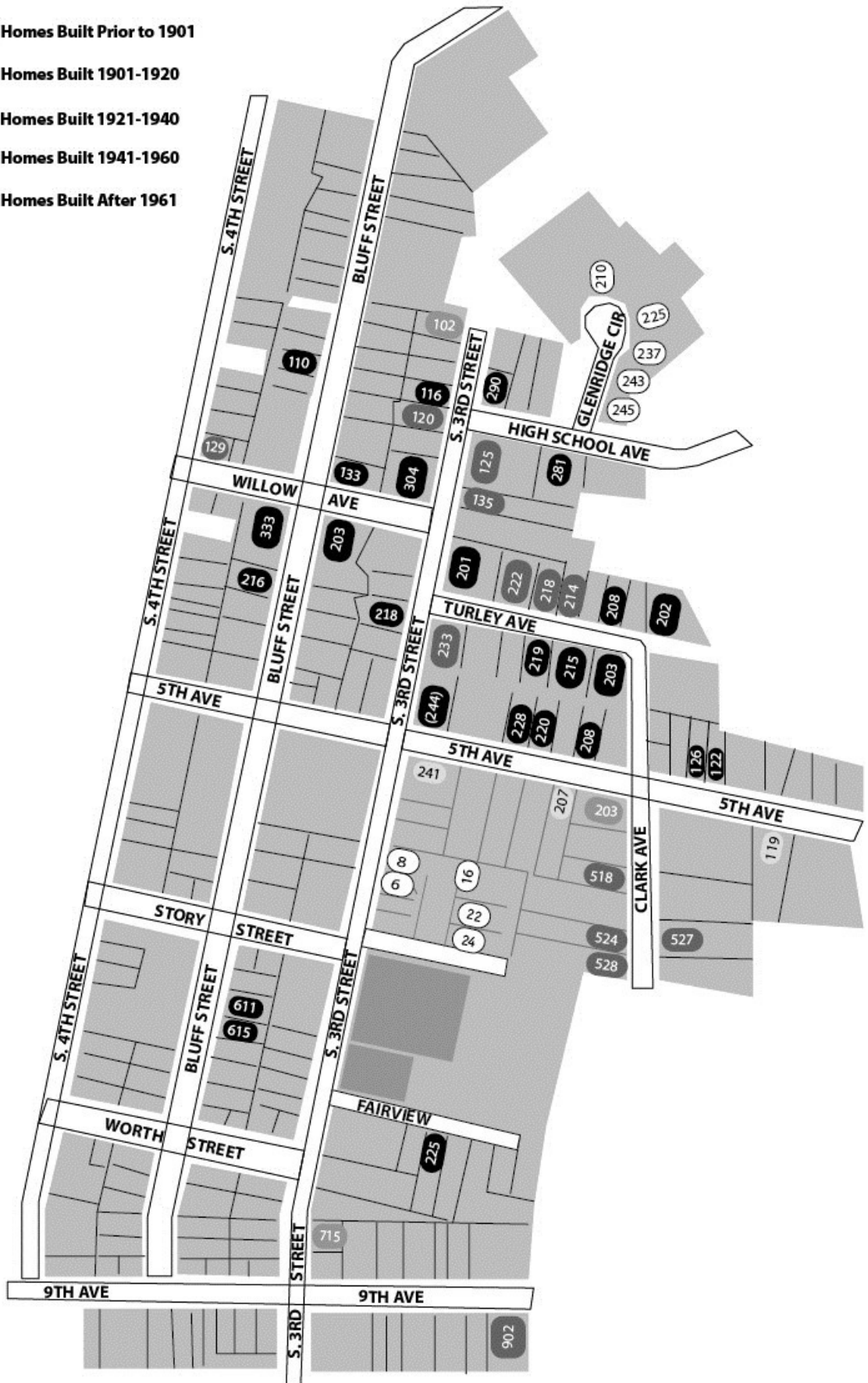

Jeremiah Folsom's original home at 137 S. Third St. originally sat at the top of the high bluff. Folsom's son, Ward, remodeled the home in 1906 and moved it down the hill.

Jeremiah Folsom was born in Tamworth, N.H., into a family whose ancestry traces back, in this country, to the landing of the pilgrims. According to a family history posted on ancestry.com, he was 12 years old when his father died.

The following year, he went to work at a store in Portland, Maine and remained there for six years. At age 19, he took a stock of goods to Michigan where he opened a merchandise store, which he operated for the next 30 years.

His 1884 obituary states, "In 1854, he removed to Council Bluffs in company with the late W.W. Maynard, the founder of The Nonpareil. On their coming to this city, they drove in from Michigan here a large flock of sheep and they were driven into a sheep fold, which stood on the present site of the Nonpareil building.

Shortly after their coming, they established and edited for a number of years The Chronotype, which was afterwards followed by the publication of The Nonpareil ... he was one of the largest owners of real estate in the city ..."

Folsom was married three times – the first time in Michigan in 1840 to Marcia Hopkins. They had three children. A year after her death in 1868, he married Sarah Blake who died four years later, in 1873. In 1876, he married Agnes Peterson and they had one son, Ward. Jeremiah Folsom died in 1884 and is buried in Fairview Cemetery.

The Folsom House stands as a sentinel, looking majestically down Willow Avenue. It originally sat farther back on the lot, below the old Council Bluffs High School at the top of the high bluff. According to the nomination of the district to the National Register of Historic Places, the house was moved forward by Ward Folsom, Jeremiah's son, who, upon his marriage in 1906, moved and remodeled the house.

The 1906 remodeling changed the house from its original Greek Revival appearance to a Colonial Revival foursquare. The two-story brick house has a hipped roof and dormers. The wrap-around porch has tripled and paired round posts which were added in 1906.

Ward Folsom lived in the house until his death in 1967. By that time, he was a retired contractor and was survived by his widow, Marion, and three nephews: District Court Judge Folsom Everest, Charles Everest and Gen. Frank Everest. Ward Folsom had the house next door (No. 135) built for his family to live in while his house was being moved and remodeled. His mother, Agnes, continued to make it her home.

Preserve the Wonderful History of C.B.!

Your Gibraltar Neighborhood is one of the *largest historical neighborhoods* in the city of Council Bluffs. If you appreciate our historical legacy, then you should know that the **Historical Society of Pottawattamie County** is a group of people with a common goal as stated in their Mission: "to preserve the past for current and future generations." The Historical Society has been instrumental in saving many historical sites in our county, and they are looking for new members who also seek to preserve our community's history. Preserve Council Bluffs has a similar mission: "to preserve and restore historic sites in the city of Council Bluffs."
