





2023 FIREWORKS ORDINANCES

Please be respectful of your neighbors (and avoid a \$250 fine!)

I think we can all agree that celebrating our Nation's independence is a wonderful thing! And, for most folks, fireworks are a blast (literally and figuratively)! But, there are LAWS on fireworks use, and we need to observe them. Last year's 4th of July holiday definitely presented many challenges, with Gibraltar neighbors VERY frustrated by ongoing late night and mid-week explosions, disrupting sleep patterns and causing distress for pets and for those affected by PTSD. City-wide, the police department reported a large number of complaints. These non-compliant fireworks also pose added fire risks and property damage risks.



This is a reminder that discharging fireworks at any time other than those listed above IS **ILLEGAL**. You may feel like it's a harmless bit of fun, but for some people (and many animals), it is very traumatic. Should you choose to discharge fireworks during non-approved days/times, *your neighbors have the right to report you*. Please also note the ordinances below, regarding the limitations of setting off fireworks near structures and the associated fines.


Council Bluffs' fireworks ordinance states:

- Individuals must be 18 years or older to possess and discharge fireworks.
- Fireworks may only be discharged on your property or that of a consenting property owner.
- Fireworks shall not be discharged in areas zoned C-3 or C-4 Commercial Districts.
- Fireworks may not be discharged within 50 feet of another person or within 50 feet of a structure.
- If Pottawattamie County has issued a burn ban, the use of fireworks is strictly prohibited.
- Any person in violation of the ordinance shall be charged accordingly and assessed a fine not less than \$250.

CITY ORDINANCE on Open Burning

What's more fun than summertime s'mores over a campfire?! Not much! But, considering that we are living in a neighborhood and not a campground, it's important to make sure you're adhering to City Codes!

- 1) **Open burning is prohibited.** This means the burning of any material that results in contaminants from combustion being emitted directly into the ambient air without passing through a stack or chimney from any enclosed chamber.
- 2) **This does** <u>not</u> apply to outdoor fireplaces or BBQ grills used solely for the noncommercial preparation of food. These are fireplaces or grills that can't be used for burning refuse or combustible waste.
- 3) **Fire containment devices like fire pits and chimineas may be used** but are subject to certain provisions as follows:
 - no outdoor burning allowed if winds exceed 10 mph
 - fires must be constantly attended by a responsible adult until thoroughly extinguished
 - fire containment devices shall not be permitted within 15 feet of any combustible structure, or within 10 feet of a lot line (unless mutually agreed upon by neighboring property owner)
 - fire pits or other fire containment devices shall not exceed 3 feet in diameter
 - flames shall be kept below 2 feet in height above the pit or containment device
 - a portable fire extinguisher or garden hose must be readily available
 - excessive smoke or odor emissions are prohibited

GENERAL NOISE ORDINANCES

Barking Dogs at All Hours of the Day & Night — IT'S NOT OKAY

Gibraltar is a dog-friendly neighborhood, and we all realize that there are certain times when your dog might need to be outside for a while (maybe you're mopping the floors... maybe Scruffy needs to burn off some energy... maybe you have dinner guests, etc.). Unfortunately, there have been some frustrations with the increased occurrence of dogs being left outside unattended for long periods of time—not just during the day, but also all night. **The problem is, DOGS BARK. A LOT.** *Not everyone is okay with that, specially since so many folks are now working from home.*

According to City Ordinance Chapter 4.50.060-6.3d: *It is unlawful to own, possess or harbor any animal or bird which frequently or for continued duration, howls, barks, meows, squawks or makes other sounds which create a noise disturbance across a residential real property boundary.* Especially with warmer weather upon us, people will have their windows open. Having to listen to ANY noise that someone else is making (hammer clanking, dog barking, music thumping, etc.), repeatedly, day after day, night after night, IS NOT OKAY. If you **must** leave your barking dog outside all day, it might be time to invest in an anti-bark device. And barking dog(s) left outside *all night*? That is never okay. Our neighbors deserve a place where they can relax and enjoy their surroundings. *Please be mindful that the noise you've learned to tune out can be extremely bothersome to others*. **Step 1: Ask your neighbor nicely to please fix the problem. Step 2: If they won't, contact Animal Control at 712-328-4656.**
